The Victory Programme – Foreword

God has a good plan for your life. His plan is to prosper you and not to harm you, to give you hope and a future. (Jeremiah 29:11) God doesn't want you to settle for anything less than His best!

Besides the workings of the Holy Spirit in your life, God's Word is one of the main agencies that He uses to bring about His 'good plan' of salvation, healing, deliverance, prosperity and wholeness in our lives. His Word ... *is alive and powerful* ... (Hebrews 4:12), it has creative power inherent within itself that brings transformation in us when *we believe it, speak it, and act on it*. (2 Corinthians 4:13)

- Healing in your heart (from any brokenness and hurts)

The Victory Programme Instructions

Preparation before you begin

1. WALKING IN LOVE

Walking with love in your heart towards others is an important area in the Christian life. It is a key to receive answers to prayer, as well as to receive God's healing, His peace, and victory in your life.

If you find it hard to love someone because you feel they have wronged you in some way, then you will need to put this right with God as this will hinder your growth and your walk with Him.

Mark 11:25

Jesus said: 'And whenever you stand praying, if you have anything against anyone, forgive him, that your Father in heaven may also forgive you your trespasses (sins).'

Forgiving others is a decision – it is NOT a feeling!

Walking in forgiveness is not based on your feelings; it is based on a decision that you (the spirit) make in obedience to God. Your feelings will come into line with your decision some time later; so don't be tempted to go by your "feelings".

Take time right now to examine your heart to see if you have any unforgiveness towards anyone. Then ask the Lord to forgive you, and to help you to walk in forgiveness with others.

PRAY (out aloud):

Heavenly Father, I make a decision to forgive _____ for

I ask You to forgive me for holding unforgiveness in my heart towards them. I thank You for bringing healing into this situation; I receive it now by faith in the name of Jesus Christ.

Do not rush this time but wait a few minutes in the presence of the Lord and allow Him to minister His healing and peace to you.

How to use the Scriptures you have chosen

1. For the **first three weeks** read the section of Scriptures you have chosen “**out loud**” – three times a day (morning, noon, night).

You will discover after this period of time that the Holy Spirit will illuminate certain Scriptures in that section to you (there will be perhaps four or five Scriptures that will really excite you more than others from the section). These are what I call your “**Breakthrough Scriptures**”.

2. After the first three weeks, continue to read all the Scriptures in the section you have chosen “**out loud**” at least once a day.
3. In addition to this, **meditate** on your “**Breakthrough Scriptures**” as much as possible throughout the day.

You can use these Scriptures to worship God during your daily time with Him, as well as when you are going about your daily activities. You could write them on card paper and keep them with you so you can read them throughout the day.

Proverbs 4:20-22

My son, give attention to My Words; incline your ear to My sayings. ²¹ Do not let them depart from your eyes; keep them in the midst of your heart; ²² for they are life to those who find them, and health (medicine) to all their flesh.

How do you follow the instruction in Proverbs 4 so that you can experience “life” and “health”? Joshua 1:8 tells you what to do:

Joshua 1:8

*This book of the Law shall not depart from your mouth, but you shall **meditate** in it **day** and **night**, that you may observe to do according to all that is written in it. For then you will make your way prosperous, and then you will have good success.*

According to a Scriptural understanding of the word “**meditate**”, a person does not just think silently about a thought, concept or idea, but they also take that thought, concept or idea and speak it out aloud.

Bible dictionaries translate the word “meditate” into the following:

“to speak, to mutter, to murmur, to roar, to ponder, to imagine”

You need to “meditate” (**speak, mutter, murmur, roar, ponder, imagine**) on your “Breakthrough Scriptures” *day and night* until victory, success, health becomes a reality in your life.

Did you notice that part of the meaning of the word “**meditate**” means “**to imagine**”?

As you “speak” the Scriptures let your imagination picture the victory. This means you are to practice visualizing or seeing the desired end result.

Initially it can take considerable effort to change the mental images of the past and present negative situations (i.e. sickness, poverty, fear, insecurity, depression, defeat, wrong habits), and replace them with godly ones (i.e. health, victory, freedom, liberty, joy, wealth). However, as you continue to “**meditate**” on God’s Word your mind will be renewed and you will experience a “**transformation**” into freedom and liberty.

John 8:31-32 NASB

*... **If you continue** in My Word, then you are truly disciples of Mine; ³² and **you will know the truth, and the truth will make you free.***

A “**transformation**” into freedom becomes a reality in the lives of those who “**continue**” to “**meditate**” on God’s Word.

Some people say: “the truth will make you free”; but they only quote half of that verse. The Scripture actually says, “you will know the truth and the truth that ‘YOU KNOW’ will make you free!” That is why we need to continue to meditate on God’s Word.

Hebrews 10:23

Let us hold fast the confession of our hope without wavering (doubting), for He who promised is faithful.

4. Be a FIGHTER! DON’T GIVE UP!

As you make a commitment to believe, and speak God’s Word, negative situations may present themselves to you. It is at this time that you may feel tempted to give up, but DON’T! You will learn that the way to resist these negative situations or temptations is to speak God’s Word to them also.

Overcoming Fear

Father God, I worship You and put my trust in You; I am not afraid, for You are my shield and my exceeding great reward.

Genesis 15:1

Father God, I will not fear, for You are my God. You are with me. You will never leave me or forsake me.

Genesis 26:24 Deuteronomy 31:8

I will not be afraid, but stand still and see Your salvation, which You shall accomplish for me today.

Exodus 14:13

Father God, You have said, that no one can curse me. There is no sorcery (magic charm) or any divination (witchcraft) against me, for You are with me. You have blessed me, and no one can reverse it. The shout of a king is in the midst of me.

Numbers 23: 20-21, 23

Blessed is he who blesses me, and cursed is he who curses me.

Numbers 24:9

Father God, I am not afraid of the enemy, for You are my God, the One who fights for me.

Deuteronomy 3:22

Father God, You have told me to be strong and of good courage, not to fear, nor be afraid, for You are My God, You are the One who goes before me and will not leave me, nor forsake me.

Deuteronomy 31:6 I Chronicles 28:20

Father, You have also said, "Have I not commanded you? Be strong and of good courage; do not be afraid, nor be dismayed, for I the Lord Your God am with you wherever you go."

Joshua 1:9

I say: I am not afraid, I am strong and of good courage, I will not fear, for You Father God are the One who goes before me.

Deuteronomy 31:6 I Chronicles 28:20

Lord, You are my Shepherd, I shall not want. You make me to lie down in green pasture, You lead me beside the still waters, You restore my soul ... Though I may walk through the valley of the shadow of death, I will fear no evil; for You are with me; Your rod and Your staff they comfort me ... Surely goodness and mercy follow me all the days of my life and I will dwell in Your house forever.

Psalms 23:4, 6

Father God, You have established me in Your righteousness; therefore I am far from oppression, for I do not fear; and from terror, for it shall not come near me. ... No weapon formed against me shall prosper, and every tongue that rises against me in judgment I condemn. This is the heritage of the servants of the Lord, for my righteousness is from You.
Isaiah 54:14, 17

Father, I thank You that You are with me always, even to the end of the age.
Matthew 28:20

Lord Jesus, You have given me authority to trample on serpents and scorpions and over all the power of the enemy, and nothing shall by any means hurt me.
Luke 10:19

I am part of Your flock, therefore I will not fear, for it is Your good pleasure to give me the kingdom.
Luke 12:32

Lord Jesus, You have given me Your peace, therefore I will not let my heart be troubled, neither shall I be afraid.
John 14:27

Father God, I am thankful to You, for I have not received the spirit of bondage leading to fear, but I have received the Spirit of adoption, and now I can call You "Abba, Father." Holy Spirit You bear witness with my spirit that I am God's child and because I am His child then I am an heir of God and a joint heir with Christ.
Wow!
Romans 8:15-17

Lord Jesus, I am growing to know the length, the depth and the height of Your love for me. This knowledge of Your love for me causes me to be filled with all the fullness of God.
Ephesians 3:19

Father God, I will not allow myself to get anxious, but in everything by prayer and supplication, with thanksgiving, I let my requests be made known to You. And Your peace, which passes all understanding, guards my heart and my mind as I rest in Christ Jesus.

Father God, I thank You that You have not given me a spirit of fear, but of power and of love and of a sound mind. I confess that I have no fear, because Your perfect love has cast out all fear, and I am free.
