Sub-title: Developing Persistent & unwavering Faith

Today we are embarking on a new series of messages on the subject of faith. We will (re)learn and be reminded of:

- · what faith is
- how to live by faith
- how faith works
- how to get faith
- how to release faith into every area of our lives

1 John 5:4–5 (NIV) For everyone born of God overcomes the world. <u>This is</u> the victory that has overcome the world, even our faith. 5 Who is it that overcomes the world? Only the one who believes that Jesus is the Son of God.

- Only (born again) believers in Jesus Christ are able to overcome the world
- Our faith in Jesus Christ lifts us above the world, into a place of victory

1. Jesus Christ will be looking for Faith at His 2nd Coming

Luke 18:1–5 (ESV) And he told them a parable to the effect that they ought always to pray and not lose heart. 2 He said, "In a certain city there was a judge who neither feared God nor respected man. 3 And there was a widow in that city who kept coming to him and saying, 'Give me justice against my adversary.' 4 For a while he refused, but afterward he said to himself, 'Though I neither fear God nor respect man, 5 yet because this widow keeps bothering me, I will give her justice, so that she will not beat me down by her continual coming.'

- Jesus taught His disciples about persistent prayer & unwavering faith
- In this parable, He used the example of a widow and an unjust judge
- The widow kept coming to the unjust judge to demand justice in her case
- Initially he refused, but eventually he ruled in her favour & gave her justice because of her persistence & her refusal to give up

Luke 18:6–8 (ESV) And the Lord said, "Hear what the unrighteous judge says.
7 And will not God give justice to his elect, who cry to him day and night?
Will he delay long over them? 8 I tell you, he will give justice to them

speedily. Nevertheless, when the Son of Man comes, will he find faith on earth?"

- Jesus contrasts the bad attitude & delayed actions of the unjust judge with the excellence of God and His swift actions towards His elect people
- The unjust judge delayed his help, and then only gave it reluctantly
- But God, who is the righteous judge, responds to us speedily
- vs.7... will not God give justice to his elect, who cry to him day and night?
- ... Will he delay long over them?
- Vs. 8 I tell you, he will give justice to them speedily
- Then, Jesus makes this profound statement:
 - o when the Son of Man comes, will he find faith on earth
- He is referring to the time when He returns to earth

Luke 18:8 (MSG) ... how much of **that kind of persistent faith** will the Son of Man find on the earth when he returns?

WuestNT. ... will He find the aforementioned kind of faith on the earth [a faith which keeps on pleading in prayer such as that exemplified by the persistance of the widow with regard to the judge]?

- Jesus will be looking for faith when He returns to earth
- Obviously, he won't be looking for some unseen force floating around in the atmosphere
- He will be looking for men, women & children who have faith in their hearts toward God. He will be looking for:
 - o People who believe that God is a prayer-answering God
 - o People who believe that God is a covenant-keeping God
 - o People who believe that all of God's promises are YES & AMEN

2. What is Faith?

Hebrews 11:1 (NIV84) Now faith is <u>being sure</u> of what we hope for and <u>certain</u> of what we do not see.

- faith is being sure of what we hope for ...
- faith is being certain of what we do not (yet) see
- When we read God's promises in the Bible, they produce hope of the very things that God has promised
- That hope isn't reality yet its only a picture (a snapshot) of the future
- Our faith causes us to be sure (confident) of the things we hope for
- It causes us to be certain of what we do not yet see

Example:

- When a sick person reads the promises of God about divine healing, they become hopeful that God will heal their body
- It is faith that gives them the surety & certainty that healing belongs to them
- It is faith that lays hold of the power of God that brings healing to their body
- Therefore, faith is confidence toward God
- Specifically, faith is confidence that God is good & that His Word is true

Hebrews 11:6 (NKJV) But without faith it is impossible to please Him, for <u>he</u> who comes to God must believe that He is, and that He is a rewarder of those who diligently seek Him.

- He who comes to God must believe that He is (that He exists)
- Therefore, faith is believing!
- We must believe that God is a rewarder of those who diligently seek Him

3. Every Believer has the Measure of Faith

Romans 12:3 (ISV) For by the grace given to me I ask every one of you not to think of yourself more highly than you should think, rather to think of yourself with sober judgment on the measure of faith that God has assigned <u>each of you.</u>

- God has assigned the measure of faith to every believer
- It is our responsibility to grow and develop our measure of faith

Example:

- Every baby is born with the same "measure" of muscles
- Each baby must develop its muscles to full functionality & capacity

4. All Things are Possible to him who Believes

Mark 9:17–20, 21-24 (NKJV) Then one of the crowd answered and said, "Teacher, I brought You my son, who has a mute spirit. 18 And wherever it seizes him, it throws him down; he foams at the mouth, gnashes his teeth, and becomes rigid. So I spoke to Your disciples, that they should cast it out, but they could not." 19 He answered him and said, "O faithless generation, how long shall I be with you? How long shall I bear with you? Bring him to Me." ... 21 So He asked his father, "How long has this been happening to him?" And he said, "From childhood. 22 And often he has thrown him both into the fire and into the water to destroy him. But if You can do anything, have compassion on us and

help us." 23 <u>Jesus said to him, "If you can believe, all things are possible</u> <u>to him who believes</u>." 24 Immediately the father of the child cried out and said with tears, "Lord, I believe; help my unbelief!"

- This father said to Jesus: If You can do anything, help us ...
- Jesus replied: If you believe, all things are possible to him who believes
- Many people know that God can do miraculous things
- But people who have faith believe that God will do miraculous things in their lives

5. Faith always has an End-Goal

1 Peter 1:3–9 (NKJV) Blessed be the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, who according to His abundant mercy has begotten us again to a living hope through the resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead, 4 to an inheritance incorruptible and undefiled and that does not fade away, reserved in heaven for you, 5 who are kept by the power of God through faith for salvation ready to be revealed in the last time. 6 In this you greatly rejoice, though now for a little while, if need be, you have been grieved by various trials, 7 that the genuineness of your faith, being much more precious than gold that perishes, though it is tested by fire, may be found to praise, honor, and glory at the revelation of Jesus Christ, 8 whom having not seen you love. Though now you do not see Him, yet believing, you rejoice with joy inexpressible and full of glory, 9 receiving the end of your faith—the salvation of your souls.

- Vs. 5 We are kept by the power of God through faith
- It is our faith that lays hold of the power of God in our lives
- Notice: ... faith for salvation
- Faith is always for something
 - o Faith for salvation produces salvation
 - Faith for healing produces healing
 - o Faith for prosperity produces prosperity
- Vs. 9 ... receiving the end of your faith—the salvation of your souls
- Faith always has an end-goal
- Many of God's promises do not come to pass automatically
- Faith always receives what God has promised
